Introduction

This document has been revised to provide a visual summary of the perceptions of VSU alumni one year and five years after graduation. Responses were received from one hundred eleven one-year out alumni who graduated during the 2004 fiscal year and ninety-four five-year out alumni who graduated during the 2000 fiscal year.

This is the second year of web-based survey administration. Three hundred thirty-two valid e-mail addresses were provided by the VSU Alumni Office for 2004 alumni and two hundred seventy-six for the 2000 alumni. The paper survey used in previous years asked alumni to repond to ninety questions. The web survey, revised with the assistance of the VSU Alumni Association, eliminated over fifty questions, leaving a total of forty-four.

E-mail invitations to participate in the survey were sent to eligible alumni in October 2005. Two follow-up invitations were sent at later intervals, and responses were collected through the end of December 2005. Return rates increased this year, with thirty-three percent of one-year out alumni and thirty-four percent of five-year out alumni responding. It is anticipated that these results will be used by colleges and departments as one indicator of the effectiveness of the University's programs and services.





Age of Respondents




<u>Gender</u>

Current State of Residence









Graduate Studies

- Of those who applied, 50 one-year out and 37 five-years out alumni were accepted to graduate school.


Were the courses in your major at VSU helpful in gaining admission to graduate or professional school?



 49 one-year out and 33 five-years out alumni said their major courses were probably or definitely helpful in gaining admission to graduate or professional school.


To what extent is/was your first job related to your major? 2/4 5/46%

Occupational area of first job?




Annual Salary History

What was your annual salary range when you began your first job?




• 38 one-year out and 46 five-years out alumni were earning between \$25,000 and \$39,999 annually at their first job.


If you are currently working, what is your annual salary range?




- 37 one-year out and 35 five-years out alumni are currently earning between \$25,000 and \$39,999 annually.




Alumni Satisfaction with Overall Quality of Education at VSU
